WHAT: CCSPCA CRUELTY/NEGLECT DOG "PEPPER" NOW READY FOR ADOPTION

WHEN: Wednesday, March 1, 2023

WHERE: CCSPCA Adoption Center, 103 S. Hughes Ave., Fresno, CA 93706

WHY: A 1-year-old white/black pit bull at the center of an animal neglect/abuse investigation is now available for adoption at CCSPCA. Additional information about Pepper's demeanor and personality can be found further down in the press release.

Earlier this year, CCSPCA Humane Officers responded to an animal cruelty complaint about an emaciated white pit bull that was confined in a small crate, with no access to food or water. They found Pepper, a white and black pit bull, confined in a small crate with items and trash surrounding her. The dog was wearing an extremely small sweater, which restricted her from laying down properly.

Pepper was found to be emaciated once the sweater was removed. CCSPCA Humane Officers discovered that she had spent the majority of her life locked in that crate and in those conditions.

This case is being submitted to the Fresno County District Attorney's office.

CCSPCA Humane Officers exercise the powers of peace officers to enforce state animal cruelty laws, make arrests, serve warrants, and file criminal charges directly with the Fresno County District Attorney's office to prosecute offenders. Reporting cases elsewhere, besides a local police department or sheriff's office, will likely jeopardize the investigation that CCSPCA Humane Officers need to do to prosecute offenders.

- Animal hoarding
- Abandonment
- Unlawful, inhumane, or unsafe living conditions
- Inadequate exercise area
